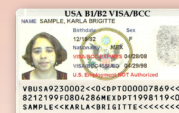

must also present one of the above.

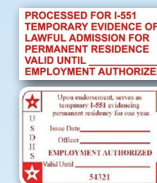
## Lawful Permanent Residents require one of the following:

ADIT Stamp

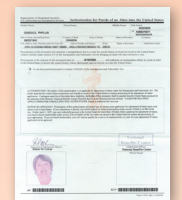
## All Others require one of the following:

\*As of June 1, 2009 U.S. & Canadian citizens under the age of 16 (or 19, if traveling with a designated group) may present a birth certificate, Consular Report of Birth Abroad, Canadian Citizenship Card, or a naturalization certificate. Until that date, all children ages 18 and under need only present proof of citizenship.
